California University of Pennsylvania received the third round of funding based on the previously (Cal U) signed federal Funding Certification and Agreement Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act to the U.S. Department of Education (USDE) on April 13, 2020.

The federal Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSA) includes funds to assist institutions of higher education and university students impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Colleges and universities received CRRSA HEERF III funding based on a formula outlined in the legislation, which also details how universities are permitted to use this new round of funding.

Cal U received around \$6,864,754 to provide emergency financial assistance directly to eligible students. Awards were made to approximately 6,201 students for the fall 2021 semester. Awards range from \$870 to \$1,475, based on the Expected Family Contribution (EFC) on the student's Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

Guidelines from the U.S. Department of Education allow Cal U to distribute CRRSA HEERF II funds as direct emergency aid to domestic undergraduate and graduate students who are enrolled in on-campus and online degree programs during the fall 2021 semester. Those who did and those who did not have a FAFSA on file were eligible.

This includes full-time and part-time degree-seeking students with a permanent U.S. address, whether they are living in on-campus residence halls, living at Vulcan Village or another off-campus location, commuting to Cal U for classes this fall, or studying 100% online.

Cal U began disbursing this aid on September 28, 2021. This money did NOT reduce any balance students may have owed to the University.
